

Meet the Presenters



Sister Sheila Carney, RSM, a Sister of Mercy for 51 years, is the Special Assistant to the President for Mercy Heritage at Carlow University in Pittsburgh, PA. With degrees in English and ministry, she has served in education at the elementary, secondary, baccalaureate levels and in elementary administration. In addition, she has served her community in the incorporation of new members, the presidency of her regional community and membership on the Institute Leadership Team. Her special interest in the story of Catherine McAuley and the charism of Mercy has created the opportunity for her to travel the Mercy world, meeting sisters and associates, giving and receiving insights on our shared heritage. Sister Sheila is the vice postulator for the Cause of the Canonization of Catherine McAuley.



Ms. Maggie Conley is the Director of the Institute Justice Team for the Sisters of Mercy of the Americas and works at the Institute office in Silver Spring, MD. She joined Mercy in 2017 and is passionate about engaging the Mercy community with the Critical Concerns. Her work also focuses on forming partnerships to bring important issues to national policies. Ms. Conley has spent all of her professional career engaging in social justice through the Catholic Church, previously working with the Jesuit Volunteer Corps and Catholic Relief Services. She serves on local boards for her parish and community and for her children's school system. She is a graduate of Xavier University in Cincinnati, Ohio, and currently lives in Silver Spring with her husband and three children.



Mr. Ed Curtin has over 25 years of teaching experience in the Theology Department at Mercyhurst Preparatory School (MPS), where he has spent almost his entire career. He received a Master of Arts in Pastoral Studies/ Religious Education from Gannon University. Mr. Curtin served MPS as assistant principal from June 2011 until his appointment as president in July 2015. He was named a Golden Apple teacher in 2008. In the past, Mr. Curtin has served as MPS Athletic Director. He was also an adjunct instructor in the Religious Studies Department at Mercyhurst College and served as the Youth Minister / Confirmation Director at St. Julia's parish in the Diocese of Erie.



Meet the Presenters



Sister Dale Jarvis, RSM, currently volunteers as Co-Chair of the Development Committee for Mercy Focus on Haiti. Sister Dale has been involved with the work of Mercy Focus on Haiti since its beginning in 2011. She travels to Haiti regularly with high schools, colleges and adult immersion programs. Prior to this position, she served as a vocation minister for 11 years. Sister Dale's first years in ministry were in education as a science teacher and principal. She has served in many social justice roles, both nationally and internationally, including chair of the Mercy International Justice Network and director of Mercy Global Concern, the Sisters of Mercy's nongovernmental organization at the United Nations.



Sister Marilyn Lacey, RSM, is the founder and Executive Director of Mercy Beyond Borders, a nonprofit working with women and girls in South Sudan, Haiti, Uganda and Kenya to alleviate their extreme poverty. She has traveled well off the beaten path, ventured into war zones and more than once stared down rebels carrying machine guns. She has been working with displaced peoples since 1981. For her life's work Sister Marilyn was personally honored by the Dalai Lama in 2001 as an "unsung hero of compassion". In 2017 Sister Marilyn received a \$1 million global award from The Opus Prize Foundation in recognition of her faith-filled leadership with Mercy Beyond Borders. She holds a Master's Degree in Social Work from UC Berkeley and three honorary doctorates, but she insists that the poor have been her best teachers.



Sister Jill Weber, RSM, has been a Sister of Mercy for 46 years. Born and raised in Mount Vernon, NY, she met the Mercies at Sacred Heart College in Belmont, NC. After ministering in elementary education and administration, she earned a degree in physical therapy. With these skills she served hospital patients at Home Health Care and children and adults with special needs at Holy Angels in Belmont. In 2010, Sister Jill volunteered to go to Haiti to assist after a devastating earthquake destroyed Port au Prince. That experience brought her back to Haiti every year. In 2012, she became part of Mercy Focus on Haiti. And after retiring from Holy Angels, she decided to spend more time in Haiti and works with Mercy Focus on Haiti and our Mercy partners there.

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
