A MESSAGE FROM THE MERCY EDUCATION CONFERENCE COMMITTEE

"Engaging in antiracist work is not about perfection but rather a constant quest for grace to see each other as Christ sees us." - Patrick Saint-Jean, SJ, *The Spiritual Work of Racial Justice*

Racism, one of the Critical Concerns of the Sisters of Mercy, calls us to work to become an anti-racist community – committed to eliminating personal and institutional racism and dismantling oppressive structures, policies and processes.

The 2022 Mercy Education Conference has the power to transform us as individuals as we take in the exhibits, presentations and panel discussion; participate in formal implicit bias training; engage in courageous conversations with colleagues from around the world; and prayerfully reflect on how we can live out the Church's teaching that: "We are one human family whatever our national, racial, ethnic, economic, and ideological differences. We are our brothers and sisters keepers, wherever they may be" (*Catholic Social Teaching*).

Furthermore, the conference has the power to shape the future. At our Mercy Education member schools, students are preparing to take their places as leaders in our world. How we as Mercy educators respond to racism and how we work to heal wounds of injustice will impact our students' perspectives, inspire their actions and create ripples of change in a world crying out for mercy.

Transformation will come only through careful and intentional effort. This year's event, over two years in the making, will equip us as modern abolitionists and challenge us to work for change. What might it spark within your classroom, your school, your community?



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Keynote Speakers








Gloria Purvis is an author, commentator and the host and executive producer of The Gloria Purvis Podcast. Through her media presence, she has been a strong Catholic voice for life issues, religious liberty, and racial justice. She has appeared in numerous media outlets including *The New York Times, The Washington Post, PBS Newshour, NPR, Newsweek,* and *Catholic Answers Live* and hosted *Morning Glory,* an international radio show. She recently debuted a video series entitled <u>Racism,</u> <u>Human Dignity and The Catholic Church</u> through the Word on Fire Institute. She is the Inaugural Pastoral Fellow at the McGrath Institute for Church Life at Notre Dame University and recently received an Honorary Doctorate in Humane Letters from the University of Portland in Oregon.

Rev. Deacon Royce Winters has been the Director of the Archdiocese of Cincinnati's Office – African American Pastoral Ministries since 2005. Deacon Winters has also been serving as Pastoral Administrator for the Church of the Resurrection [Bond Hill] since 2010. In 2015, he was sworn in as chaplain for the Cincinnati Fire Department. Prior to his Archdiocesan assignment, Deacon Royce was employed by the Cincinnati Police Department for over 26 years in various law enforcement assignments. He has served as a forensic behavioral specialist for Adult and Juvenile Sex Offender Treatment Programs in Ohio and Kentucky, and for the U.C. Health Department of Forensic Psychiatry and Behavioral Neuroscience. Rev. Mr. Royce Winters has been married to Rita Winters for 47 years. They have three children and two grandchildren.

Alicia Zapata, RSM, has been a Sister of Mercy for 48 years. In her early years in community she ministered in Panama, Central America and the inner city of Brooklyn, New York. She also spent time in Argentina, South America. Sister Alicia has served as an interpreter from Spanish to English and vice versa for the Institute of the Sisters of Mercy while serving the farmworker community in Central Florida where she ministered for 32 years. The ministry with the farmworkers called her to become well versed in immigration law, and she was Bureau of Immigration Appeals accredited. Sister Alicia has also served in leadership roles for the Sisters of Mercy and currently serves as a Sister Life Minister, living in Brooklyn, New York.

Christopher Calderón, S.J. (MA, MDiv, EdM) serves as the Dean of Students at Cristo Rey High School in Sacramento, California. He has served in 9 secondary education institutions over the past 20 years as spiritual director, teacher, campus minister, trustee and in other administrator roles. In each of these roles, DEI (Diversity, Equity and Inclusion) work, hand-in-hand with Ignatian Spirituality, has informed his way of proceeding, affirming the Catholic Social Teaching tenet: where you stand determines what you see, and how you stand determines how you build and experience community and so encounter Christ.





Traci Smith, M.Ed, has over 18 years of experience as a secondary educator. She earned her Master's in Education from the Harvard Graduate School of Education in Urban Education and Policy. Traci recently finished a graduate certificate program at Northwestern University in Leading Equity and Inclusion in Organizations. She is currently the Director of Diversity, Equity & Inclusion at Mercy High School in Farmington Hills, Michigan. In 2021, Traci chaired and planned a regional Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Conference for Metro Detroit teachers. Throughout her career, Traci has worked with programs to mentor youth, international cultural exchanges, and post-secondary readiness. Traci has been married to her husband Keith for over 14 years, and they share a 10-year-old daughter Savannah and are finalizing the adoption of their 4-year-old son, Tyler.

Krista Taylor is the assistant principal at Mercy Montessori Center in Cincinnati, Ohio. She has led the DEIB (Diversity, Equity, Inclusion and Belonging) committee at Mercy since its inception in 2021. This work has included staff training, staff and parent discussion groups, the hiring of a fractional Director of Diversity, and the drafting of a DEIB strategic plan. Krista worked previously as an Intervention Specialist, Montessori Coordinator, and Team Leader at Gamble Montessori High School in the Cincinnati Public Schools. During her time at Gamble, she coordinated monthly team-based dialogues around issues of equity in education, conducted building-wide equity-based data analysis, and cofacilitated a series of Conversations on Race and Equity that involved staff, students, parents, and community members, with a focus on centering student voices.


