PROGRAM GOALS

- > Student leaders will grow in their understanding of the mission of Mercy and Catherine McAuley.
- They will engage with Mercy Critical Concerns with a special focus on Care for Earth by planning advocacy projects for their school communities and participating in service learning.
- They will enhance individual leadership skills and goals through various exercises and activities.

Who: The conference invites representative student leaders from various school ministries (i.e. student council/student government, ministry team, community service corps leaders, those leading environmental efforts) and others whom the school feels will most benefit from our program. We recommend sending rising juniors and/or seniors. Number of representatives per school: 6 students maximum.

When: Sunday afternoon, June 18 - Wednesday morning, June 21, 2023.

Where: <u>Salve Regina University</u>, 100 Ochre Point Avenue; Newport, Rhode Island 02840 USA. La universidad es una institución patrocinada por las Hermanas de la Misericordia. View <u>directions</u> and <u>campus map</u>.

Tuition: \$350.00 per student, includes all on-site costs including room and board and activities. This fee does not include travel. No fee required for chaperones (1 to 2 maximum are required for each school group).

Accommodations: Accommodations for students and chaperones will be provided at Salve Regina University. Students and chaperones will stay in campus dormitory on campus, with chaperones in single rooms and students in shared suites. A linen package with sheets and towels is included. More information will be provided after registration.

Air Travel: Rhode Island T.F. Green International Airport, approximately 45 minutes from Salve Regina University (30 miles).

Parking: Chaperones will receive parking information after registration.

Student Presentations on Critical Concerns: We are requesting that each school's student delegation prepare a 10-15 minute presentation that shares how your school lives out all the Mercy Critical Concerns, especially Earth. The presentation can also include significant Mercy traditions that you celebrate at your school.
