De acuerdo con la filosofía y la misión de la escuela, cada estudiante del Colegio de Muffles debe completar 100 horas de servicio comunitario voluntario como requisito de graduación.

Los estudiantes del Primer Nivel (Form 1) deben completar 20 horas de trabajos de servicio en su escuela. Esto permite que el personal del Colegio de Muffles supervise al estudiante en la escuela durante el transcurso del año según lo programado por el maestro de religión.

Los estudiantes de los cursos II, III y IV (Form II, III, IV) deben completar en la comunidad 20 horas de Obras de Misericordia cada año, ayudando a los necesitados y más vulnerables, además del servicio comunitario como parte de sus clases de religión.


Al finalizar sus horas cada año, los estudiantes presentan un informe escrito con los siguientes componentes:

- ✓ Portada ilustrada con título.
- ✓ Evidencia:
 - Un formulario de testigo completado por el supervisor del servicio que enumera las actividades, el rango de fechas y la cantidad de horas brindadas.
 - Fotos de la experiencia del servicio.
 - Una biografía escrita por el estudiante sobre la(s) persona(s)/institución(es) servida(s)
- ✓ Documentación personal. Para ello, el estudiante presenta:
 - Un diario resumido
 - Una reflexión sobre el crecimiento personal durante el tiempo de servicio.
 - Una oración por la(s) persona(s)/institución(es) a quienes sirvieron
 - Recomendaciones para mejorar el programa de servicio.



BIOGRAPHY



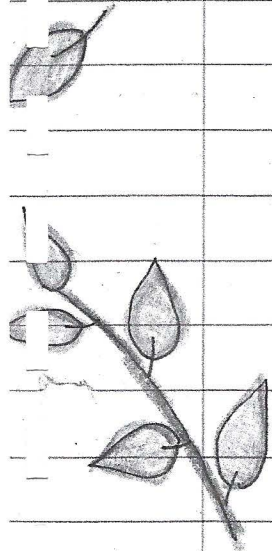




As my act of mercy, I chose to tutor two girls from standards I and III. In the beginning, the girls were reserved and had difficulty focusing on the activities but as time passed, they understood that there were rules that they had to follow during their working period. I assisted them in their weak areas of Math and English by providing worksheets such as basic math operations and sentence structure rules. We also read to enhance their fluency, pronunciation and vocabulary by reading fairytales and bible stories. We also did some coloring, where the girls expressed themselves and showed their creativity. It allowed the girls to not get overwhelmed with too much schoolwork. We also worked on their grammar, by testing their spelling level and punctuation skills while also taking some time to work on their penmanship. It was important to take some time to do this as the girls had not been taught the proper basics of writing due to online classes. Lastly, I made the girls participate in bible storytelling. In this way, it helped the children learn who God is and all the good things He created. This also allowed them to trust in God and start building a "living relationship" with Him. After all, God is our Father, and we are his children.






On the best day, the girls and I participated in a prayer service, in which we started by praying "Saint Michael the Archangel Prayer", followed by reading 2 Timothy 2:15 which talked about how we should study and show God that we understand Him to the point where we know what are false teachings and philosophies. This also applied to the girls and me as it talked about how we should indulge ourselves in our schoolwork and do the best that we can. We should always be serious when it comes to education by preparing ourselves for them and always being productive. We then offered four petitions for God's blessing on San Narciso R.C. School, the health of their families, our church leaders, and our government. We ended off by singing "This little light of mine" which speaks of sharing our faith in others and letting our light shine in the darkness.




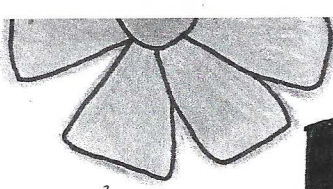


PERSONAL GROWTH

This was because whenever I saw one of the girls frowning, I would ask them what was wrong and correct them where they went wrong. I always told them that the only way for me to help them was for them to ask for help, just as God wants us to seek Him first. Lastly, I would say I got to form a bond with these girls over the week. These girls were a ray of sunshine in my life that will never dimmer. I came to realize that God sent me this opportunity for a reason, to help these girls and teach them about not only the importance of education but of His everlasting love.





PERSONAL PRAYER


Dear heavenly Father,


