For those struggling to forgive or be forgiven, we pray:

*Compassionate God, pour out your mercy upon them.*

For those seeing justice for themselves or others, we pray:

*Compassionate God, pour out your mercy upon them.*

For those who serve others through the spiritual and corporal works of mercy, we pray:

*Compassionate God, pour out your mercy upon them.*
